We are still gathering surveys and compiling information, but we can hardly wait to share the details with everyone. Open Farm days is an amazing opportunity to showcase your Ag Society, your community, your members, and all the world class food produced right here in Alberta.

Our association successfully has been implementing programs and developing resources based on feedback and research. Our previous studies, completed by Richard Hudson, have been a cornerstone for building valued products and enhancing relationships. Part one of the current study has been completed. Thank you to all the Ag Societies who not only participated in this critical analysis but also to those who donated some of their hard-earned cash to the project. The board of AAAS will be using the initial information to hone the direction of the second part of the study which will assist in setting a course for AAAS and our members. Stay tuned, we hope to have more information available during our fall meetings.

Speaking of our Fall Regional meetings, the dates and locations will be available very soon. Be sure to grab a friend and come out to this informative meeting. We always get an opportunity to hear what's going on with our members and share some great stories. Remember that attending these meeting can be claimed on your annual "Leadership under Development". grant Registration fees, travel, and accommodations are all eligible, just like coming to the annual conference and AGM.

I would like to challenge those Ag Societies who come regularly (you know who you are) to contact a neighboring Ag Society and invite them to attend. Perhaps share a ride and gain some insight in possible future collaborations. I look forward to seeing everyone there.

AGLC has been at the forefront of my activities of late. We recently learned of changes to the policy handbook, which holds all the rules for accessing gaming funds. This includes bingos. 50/50. casinos. etc. I have had raffles. conversations with several Ministers, the Premier, and most recently the chair of the AGLC Board. We have expressed our concerns with section 4.4.12 - Cost Recovery. This is a new section to the policy handbook which was reviewed in May of 2022. If you have a gaming licence of any kind, I encourage you to check out the newest regulation. If you have the same concerns that AAAS sees please contact your MLA. The current section has every opportunity to alter your cash flow significantly. If you have questions, please give me a shout at the office. More news should be available at the fall meetings.

September 21st is Alberta Agricultural Societies Day. This is your invitation to shout out all the amazing things you do in and for your community. Tell the stories, share the success', how you over came challenges, and what the future might hold. This is an opportunity to honour those whose time talent and treasure brought your Ag Society this far. Happy Agricultural Societies Day on September 21st – thanks for all the great things that you do for rural communities across Alberta!

A few things you may be interested in:

Regional Agricultural Societies Sustainability Assessment Study

Agriculture and Irrigation has engaged Deloitte to conduct a sustainability assessment of Alberta's seven regional agricultural societies. This comprehensive assessment will help the province to better understand the unique challenges and opportunities associated with regional societies, and how to better support the work they do into the future. The sustainability assessment was announced on July 31, 2024 and will be completed this fall.

The assessment will provide recommendations, options, and analysis on how each regional agricultural society is meeting its mandate with potential consideration to factors such as: provincial government funding levels, strengthening board governance, management of capital infrastructure and operations, the current structure of regional agricultural societies, and how to strengthen agricultural relevancy and build community involvement and impact.

While this project does not analyze the 284 primary agricultural societies, we wanted to ensure that all agricultural societies are aware of this important study and our commitment to working to support all agricultural societies. We look forward to continuing to partner with all agricultural societies and understanding how we will build a stronger future that will improve agriculture and enhance the quality of life in their communities.

AGRICULTURE AND IRRIGATION UPDATE

From the desk of Carmen Andrew, Director, Rural Programming Section, Agriculture and Irrigation.

Agricultural Societies Infrastructure Revitalization Program (ASIRP)

The second intake of this \$2.5 million/year capital grant program to support major repairs at existing agricultural facilities was fully subscribed in record time in early June. Thirty-seven agricultural societies received grants to help address issues related to aging agricultural society infrastructure.

Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership - New On-Farm Efficiency Program

The Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership in Alberta has launched the On-Farm Efficiency Program (OFEP). OFEP was created by combining the past Farm Technology Program and Efficient Grain Handling Program, along with some new opportunities that were selected in response to industry feedback collected in the fall of 2023. The On-Farm Efficiency Program's intent is to help producers achieve environmental benefits by improving the efficient use of agricultural inputs. The program opened for applications August 14, 2024 and funding is retroactive to April 1, 2023. Eligible expenses are funded at a cost-share rate of 50 per cent. The funding maximum per applicant is \$150,000 over the duration of the Program (2023-2028). To learn more and apply, visit the OFEP website at alberta.ca/onfarm-efficiency-program

FARMING THE SUN IN A DIFFERENT WAY



The increase of Alberta residents and businesses incorporating solar systems (photovoltaics) into their homes and facilities to offset their electricity consumption is at an all-time high. In June of 2020 there were approximately 5,900 systems in operation capable of producing ~82MW, now in June of 2024 there are just under 24,000 systems capable of producing ~270MW of clean, green power (Source: Alberta Electric Systems Operator's Small Distribution-Connected Resources in Alberta report). A couple of factors are responsible for the large increase over this time, the now cancelled Canada Greener Homes Grant which offset costs by a maximum of \$5,000 per residential home, cheap financing through the currently available Canada Greener Homes Loan (10-year interest free) and Clean Energy (available Program Improvement through municipalities in Alberta with varying terms and interest rates), and the continued rise of electricity pricing.

What farms should be strongly considering is the Clean Technology Investment Tax Credit (CTITC) which will provide a 30% tax rebate to any businesses (including agri-businesses) that are a taxable entity, that invest in solar for their operations. For example, an agri-business invests in a solar system that costs \$100,000.00, they will receive a \$30,000.00 rebate. Further to that, they can also claim the Accelerated Capital Cost Allowance (ACCA - Class 43.1 and 43.2) on the remaining 70% of the project cost (\$70,000.00 in this example). The exact amount of tax savings from the ACCA, depends on the tax rate you pay so get your accountants involved. The federal government has stated that solar systems that have been installed since March 2023 will be able to apply for the CTITC when it officially launches sometime this year.

Estimated economic payback on a sizable solar system is around 5-7 years when taking advantage of the CTITC. Which means once the system has paid itself off, it'll be producing free power for your operation and these systems will easily last beyond 40-50 years. You should expect to replace an inverter a couple times over those years, but it is a relatively small cost to the overall project. Solar modules (panels) come with manufacturers production warranty for 25-30 years, which guarantees that they'll still be producing electricity at an ~85% rate of when they were installed, so they degrade very slowly.

But how does it all work once the system is operating:

- Your electricity meter which normally only records the amount of electricity the farm is consuming will be replaced with one that will record the amount of electricity you send back onto the grid also (export)
- Your farm will first use the electricity produced from the solar system, saving you money on your bill because you aren't bringing in electricity from the grid
- If the farm isn't using all the energy the solar system is creating (over producing) then the electricity will flow back through your utility meter and back onto the grid, creating a credit on your bill. For example, you are buying electricity from an energy retailer at \$0.10/kwh, when you export electricity back onto the grid you will be credited at \$0.10/kwh on your bill
- At night or during cloud heavy days, when the solar system isn't producing enough electricity for the farm, the grid will make up the difference and provide what is needed

Recommendations from a person who has been working in Alberta's solar industry for over 15-years:

- 1. Get 3 quotes We have seen high pressure sales forces knocking on doors giving outlandish and incorrect information on solar just in hopes of landing sales that can be 60% higher than fair market rate. Don't be in a rush to sign a contract
- 2. Consider whether the company you are choosing is active in the Alberta market and has history here. There are "solar contractors" out there that have no physical presence in the province, they operate remotely with a heavy social media presence, sub-contract all the installation labour to the lowest cost provider
- Read Google reviews on potential contractors and ask for references for similar sized projects
- 4. Start your project in the late summer or fall, do not wait for spring It'll take time to properly engineer and permit your system with your municipality and wire service provider. Ideally if your system can be energized in late winter or early spring, you will be set up to start producing large amounts of electricity during the prime spring, summer and fall months. Wait til spring to sign a contract and you won't likely be producing electricity until late summer or fall at best, which are lower production months

Events & Festivals Fund is open to communities, associations, and businesses for events that have been running a minimum of 3 years and meet the following eligibility requirements: Events lasting two or more days that charge admission and target overnight visitation. Minimum ask is \$25k with 25% matching required.
