For any organization to understand their financial position, prospect, and future, good bookkeeping practices are essential. The Treasurer's Training program has been designed with these considerations in mind. We have also considered how precious time is to everyone. The workshop is continuously being improved for the learner. There are 2 opportunities coming in the fall to gain this valuable information. Please head to our website to find out when and where the next class will take place and get registered.

Outcomes of the program will allow the Treasurer to provide clear and concise financial reporting to the board as well as the accountant, while saving time and frustration.

Governance has long been a key factor in the challenges and success of Agricultural Societies and boards in general. AAAS has been providing resources and training to improve the understanding of board members as to their roles and responsibilities for more than a decade. 





Visit the host farms page to start adding locations to your trip. Click the green "Add to Trip" button on each farm you want to visit.


Step #2: Review Your Trip

On Friday May 5th I had learned of the fire at SLCN and I called out to the Board to say we should offer our facility in case it's needed. I have the pleasure of working on a board of volunteers who are amazing, giving souls. We at the AG Society have been blessed over the past 55 years to have been able to build and maintain the Jack Williamson Memorial Ag Plex hall, the Cow Palace, the Exhibit Hall and the Red Barn, the outdoor rodeo arena and general grounds. All of these spaces including the outdoor pens came in very handy. We volunteered our facility and service and our time.



I called the Town of Valleyview, Chief Sheldon of SLCN and the MD to let them know we were on stand by for the fire in whatever capacity we could help. By 2:20pm I was on site at the Ag Plex and shortly there after we received busloads of children that were unable to go home due to the fire. Amanda Roy of Green View FCSS joined me at the Ag Plex and we became co-coordinators and Joni Rohloff was chosen to be our livestock coordinator.



Following the children's event we began accepting pets. Callouts were made via Facebook for crates and supplies and it was within minutes that people came to the Ag Plex



to deliver everything we required to care for these pets. We had many people volunteer to set up kennels and to walk and feed and socialize with all these pets and to do daily cleaning. Record keeping became an immediate task as it was important to us to keep the pets and owners connected. We labelled our gates and created a checkpoint for people to make it clear and easy how to work our intake process. At one point we had over 160 animals including dogs, cats, horses, turtles, chicks, donkeys and ostrich on the property. These pets were with us from May 5th to May 15th.



We used our hall for small dogs, our exhibit hall for cats, our indoor arena for medium to large dogs and our red barn for large and or challenging dogs. The pens at the outdoor arena were for horses.


The volunteer base quickly increased and each day our system of record keeping, maintenance, and pet care improved. We were blessed with Aimee Caron as our registered animal health tech who volunteered her time and knowledge to ensure we were on top of pet health. She kept in contact with our local vet as well.



#REALAGSTORIES

We created a schedule to ensure we had volunteers to cover the daily tasks of cleaning, walking and feeding the pets. Overall we had 160 recorded volunteers and 1376 man hours put into this event. We were fed amazing meals and snacks by The Olde Country Inn and by the United Church Women and other local volunteers.





Local businesses and people donated crates, construction panels, dog food, toys, cleaning supplies and so much more. We are working on our list of "thank you's" for the donations.



With the enormous amount of donations we received we are asking for a bit of help. I know we missed recording some. If you donated anything at all please reach out to us to let us know so we can thank you properly. And if we have any items of yours that you would like back please contact us and we will arrange return.

A couple days before the Town of Valleyview was evacuated I had watched the interview I was in and saw the organization called AARCS. Knowing it would be impossible to evac the animals on our own, should the town be evacuated, this organization was contacted and they came to our assistance on the very day of evacuation.

All of the furry friends we had gotten to know over a ten day period were safely transported to a safe location, they left our beloved Ag grounds at 8:45pm that same day. We did have to ask the 4H to consider relocating their show and sale event due to the uncertainty of whether we would still have pets by their event date, or whether we would have our facility back in order in time. And a few other events / renters we would have hosted also had to make other arrangements in town, and they were able to do so.

It took many volunteers from Valleyview, SLCN, the MD, Bandaged Paws, AARCS (Alberta Animal Rescue Crew Society) and CATF (Canadian Animal Task Force) to pull off this amazing, organized, safe pet evacuation care centre and relocation during the wildfire event and the Board of Directors of the Valleyview Agricultural Society are extremely grateful for having had the opportunity to be of service to our community.



We at the Ag Society have never done anything of this magnitude before and we learned so much about this great community we live in. We would like to thank everyone that contributed to this event, for with you all, we were able to do what it is we are here to do...build community, support community, grow community!

We would also like to thank the MD of Greenview for their continued support and leadership all around during this wildfire event.






