



### **Agricultural Society Innovation Award**

- Recognizes agricultural societies for their innovation, resilience, and commitment to their communities
- Applications are open until November 29<sup>th</sup>
- 3 categories
  - Smaller primary (less than 1,000 people)
  - Larger primary (1,000 or more people)
  - Regional

# Agricultural Societies Infrastructure Revitalization Program (ASIRP)

- \$2.5 million per year
  - 34 projects in 2023 and 37 projects in 2024
  - 71 agricultural societies of all sizes so far (almost ¼)

Projects are starting to be completed (have 18 months)

Next intake - new fiscal year in 2025
